By helping families overcome challenges like unemployment, unstable housing, and lack of education, we can lead families down a path toward increased stability and, ultimately, self-sufficiency.

Christmas of 2018, we were able to provide:

- 484 - Children with toys and clothing
- 224 - Families with food
- 568 - Nursing Home Patients with gifts
- 30 - Senior Adults with gifts
- 2726 - Area inmates and patients at Western State received socks

In 1891, Captain Joseph McFee wanted to help the poor people in San Francisco; especially for the coming Christmas season, but he didn't know where to get funding for his project. Captain McFee placed a pot at the Oakland Ferry Landing, beside the pot was a sign that read "Keep the Pot Boiling." He was able to collect enough donations to have a Christmas dinner for the people.
